What makes us tick?

The Kennett After-School Association (KASA) was founded in 1999 by a group of citizens acting in partnership with the United Way of Chester County and the Kennett Church of the Advent to meet the needs of our Kennett Middle School children. The program has grown considerably, but is still run by just one full-time staff member. The Kennett School District partners with KASA to provide facilities for After-The-Bell in our beautiful Kennett Middle School.

Our middle school students are a diverse and enthusiastic group who need a safe environment to help them develop mature interests and a strong sense of self. Participation in the array of activities provided three times each year offer many opportunities to build life skills in a nurturing after-school environment.

Close to 200 volunteers, including retired and active teachers, parents, local professionals, senior citizens, as well as high school and college students from Kennett and the surrounding area, share their time and interests with students. Volunteers lead or assist in activities, contact other volunteers and create new activities, distribute snacks, accompany students to offsite activities, and often mentor students along the way. We need you!

Community financial support comes from the United Way, foundations, commerce and industry, and public contributions. We neither receive nor seek any tax payer money to run After-The-Bell.

As you can see, we depend heavily on the generous support of the Kennett Community and YOU, our parents, through your volunteering, donations, and enthusiastic support!

After-The-Bell is Free ... But it still costs money to run.

Even though we have very low overhead and After-The-Bell is run by volunteers, it still costs nearly \$260 per student per cycle to participate in After-The-Bell. Transportation, program supplies, activity costs, insurance and staff salaries add up quickly!

Our Mission: After-The-Bell provides a supervised after-school program of recreational, social and academic skill-developing activities for Kennett Middle School students. The program is led by community volunteers and provided without charge.

After-The-Bell is an after-school program for students in the Kennett Middle School. The Kennett After-School Association sponsors After-The-Bell to provide an enjoyable learning experience in a safe environment. After-The-Bell is open to all students of the Kennett Middle School and is free of charge, voluntary, and subject to the availability of space and facilities. After-The-Bell does not discriminate in its educational programs, activities, or employment practices, based on race, color, sex, sexual orientation, disability, age, religion, ancestry, union membership, or any other legally protected classification.

After-The-Bell is offered in three six-week programs during the school year – Fall, Winter, and Spring - on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from <u>2:35 pm to 5:00 pm</u>. Transportation home is provided. Participants receive a healthy snack and relax in the cafeteria before starting the first session at 3:00 pm. Each activity is 1 to 2 hours, depending upon the nature of the activity. If school is canceled or there is an early dismissal, After-The-Bell will not meet.

Rights and Responsibilities

- A student should take the appropriate time to learn about the activities and should remain in the same activities for the program.
- We try to give students their first choice of activity but maintain the flexibility to choose from their 2nd or 3rd choice if necessary.
- When you receive the letter informing you of the activities assigned, <u>please notify us</u> immediately if your child does not intend to participate. We always have students on a waiting list for all of the fun activities.
- Students must follow the After-The-Bell Code of Conduct at all times to be able to remain in After-The-Bell.
- Any student attending After-The-Bell may request Bus Transportation home at no charge. Students must follow our Code of Conduct while riding on the bus. Bus service is provided by After-The-Bell, not the Kennett Consolidated School District.
- Students who are registered for After-The-Bell on a given day must attend their After-The-Bell activities; students may not leave their activities to attend school sports games.
- Some activities are very popular. Therefore, if you sign up for a particular activity as
 your first choice more than once during a program, even if your application is received early, you may be scheduled for that activity only once.
- After-The-Bell makes every effort to provide the scheduled activities. After-The-Bell
 will provide an alternative if an activity is canceled due to weather, facilitator absence, etc.

After-The-Bell Code of Conduct

Safety • Respect • Self-Discipline

Upon registering for After-The-Bell, all students and parents agree to this **Code of Conduct**. The Code of Conduct defines how all students must behave to attend After-The-Bell activities. These rules apply for all hours. They apply to all locations, at the Middle School, at off-site activities, and on any bus.

All students must behave safely and with respect for themselves all volunteers, staff, and other students.

At the beginning of each program, the staff will meet with the students to set the expectations for proper behavior - to listen to and follow instructions from the facilitators and staff, to speak only in a respectful manner, and to follow all school rules.

The cornerstones of our code of conduct are safety, respect, and self-discipline. We promote safety, show respect, and learn self-discipline through: 1) our language and 2) our actions toward others.

The first time a student misbehaves, his/her parents may be contacted and he/she may be **dismissed from the program immediately.** The staff of After-The-Bell will determine the decision to allow the student to return during the current program or to any future program. Staff may also decide the student must participate in different activities geared toward promoting proper behavior. If these changes in activities are not acceptable to the student or parents, the child always has the option of withdrawing from the current program.

The following are examples of behaviors that will cause students to be dismissed from After-The-Bell *immediately!*

- Inappropriate behavior such as lying, bullying, bad language, swearing, threats, name-calling, or any language which could cause emotional injury to students, staff, or volunteers
- Inappropriate actions which may cause injury to people or property including insulting gestures, throwing objects at others, pushing, fighting, stealing, and destroying property
- Showing disrespect by ignoring, disobeying, talking back, or being sarcastic to volunteers or staff
- Disruptive behavior in the cafeteria, the halls, the activities, or on the bus, which may include continuing
 to talk when asked to quiet down, continuous and intentional interruption of a volunteer, a member of
 the staff, or another student
- Being disrespectful of school property, such as touching the teacher's desk, SmartBoards, whiteboard, books, displays, or equipment.
- Use of cell phones, iPads, and Earphones. Earbuds, iBooks/Kindles/other electronic readers may be
 allowed during certain times/activities. However, ATB is not responsible in the case of a mishap or loss
 of this property.

By signing the Registration Form, both student and parent are stating the following:

I understand that After-The-Bell is a completely voluntary and free after-school program that is provided by volunteers and community donations. I may choose at any time to remove my child from the program. My child is expected to behave safely and respectfully when attending After-The-Bell. If my child breaks any rules, I will be contacted by the staff. I understand that my child may then be dismissed from his/her choice of activity and/or the entire program year for misbehavior. After-The-Bell Activities

4-H STEM Woodworking for Wildlife (TUESDAY) Create your own projects for wildlife or for the school's nature trail. This is for youth who enjoy the outdoors and truly wish to enhance the wildlife habitat areas they enjoy at home or at school. Goals: Bat box & Eastern Bluebird box construction & placement.

4-H Kitchen Chemistry (TUESDAY) Incorporates common household food or health items used to create science experiences. Learn about what matter is and how it changes form; explore the different properties of matter; find out about acids and bases; and discover how everyday items and kitchen ingredients can be used in cool tests!

Art with Mrs. Uhl- Ceramics (WEDNESDAY) It's time to play with clay! Students will learn basic pottery techniques for hand-building and glazing while also learning to throw on a pottery wheel.

Art with Mrs. Uhl- Altered Book Art with Alcohol Markers and Paint (WEDNESDAY) An altered book artist takes a book (old, new, recycled or multiple) and modifies it in various ways, such as cutting, tearing, folding, or embedding objects. Altered books may be as simple as adding a drawing or text to a page, or as complex as creating an intricate book sculpture.

Bake Shop (THURSDAY) Do you love to bake? We'll set up and run a company to bake and sell cookies, cupcakes, and other treats! They're so much fun to make, sell and eat. Learn the basics of running a baking business!

Basketball (TUESDAY & THURSDAY) Shoot hoops, have fun and learn the skill of basketball or improve your game.

Board Games (ALL DAYS) Checkers, Battleship, The Game of Life, Risk, UNO, Monopoly, Connect4 & so many others. Make new friends while playing your favorite board games.

Brain Base (ALL DAYS) Do you need some extra time to get your homework finished or want to finish early? Do you sometimes need help with studying and projects? Catch up or get ahead on your studies. Go online to see your homework assignments, check your grades, or see how far you have come!

Chess Club (THURSDAY) ATB Chess Club is great for Beginners thru Masters. Learn how the pieces move, common tactics, and how to outmaneuver and out-think your opponent. Use your queen to wreak havoc on your opponent and ultimately force their King to surrender!

Cops/1st Responders! (WEDNESDAY) Sirens screaming! Lights flashing! What is it like to be a police officer, EMT or Firefighter? Have fun and learn from a police officer and our local fire company.

Dungeons and Dragons (TUESDAY) Beginner adventurers are needed to bring this storytelling adventure to life. We will use our imaginations to make daring choices while we explore fantastic realms to save the Sword Coast. All activities reinforce language arts, problem-solving, and interpersonal skills.

Fashion Through Hand Knitting (WEDNESDAY) Learn how to create a fashion inspiration board and hand knit a fun scarf or a hat. Hand knitting is a great relaxing activity that not only helps in reducing the fabric waste generated by the fashion industry, but also improves your math skills! Curious? Join and you will love it!

Floor Hockey (TUESDAY) Pass, score, learn stick skills and have fun playing this exciting floor version of ice hockey. Learn new skills from a local ice hockey coach. Equipment is provided. Just wear your sneakers and have fun!

Friends Home (WEDNESDAY) Do you like serving others? You will be traveling to Friends Home in town to spend time, play board games, and make crafts with their residents. You'll have fun and make new friends!

Ink Painting (TUESDAY) Join us! Ink is a medium that will connect you with an ancient technique dating back to the Han Dynasty of China. Pet Portrait Painting (THURSDAY) Have fun learning how to paint your pet! Show your creative side! Have fun making a beautiful keepsake with step-by-step instructions from a wonderful local artist! Make sure you bring a photo of your pet.

Perler Beading (ALL DAYS) Relax while you create beautiful necklaces, keychains, and even 3-dimensional décor using colorful Perler beads. Arrange beads to form patterns and fuse them to make colorful works of art!

Program and Design Games (TUESDAY) Learn how to code basic programs using block code and design your own game from scratch. There will be many challenges that we can code using different websites and platforms. You don't need any prior experience at all!

Seafood Cooking Class (TUESDAY) Learn to cook many kinds of fish and shellfish. One of the great things about seafood is that it is easy and yummy! Learn ways to cook that give you skills that to walk into the kitchen and fix yourself a broiled salmon or a sea bass taco (by the way, this is your instructor's favorite breakfast). Here's a bonus you get to eat everything you and your classmates make! For those with food allergy concerns: we will cook many different shellfish, we will use dairy products frequently, and we'll use nuts occasionally.

YMCA Physical Fitness (THURSDAY) Want to learn about exercise and fitness? Using the Y's strength building equipment & techniques, we will give you the tools to do just that! Join the fun Fitness Staff at the Kennett YMCA! Wear proper clothes and sneakers

Yoga (TUESDAY) Practice yoga at KMS. Join in the fun while de-stressing from your classes. Each relaxing class includes yoga poses, breathing exercises, mantra meditation, and more. Yoga is open to everyone. No yoga experience is required. Mats and towels are provided. Wear comfy clothes.

After-The-Bell Registration Instructions

- Registration is on a first-come-first-served basis. Incomplete registration forms may not be processed, causing students to miss the opportunity to be included in their desired classes. Activities fill quickly.
- Write a 1 next to your first choice activity, 2 for your second choice and 3 for your 3rd
 choice for each session 3-4 and 4-5 or double session 3-5. Please circle your overall first
 choice for each day you will be participating. Leave blank if you are not participating on a
 specific day.
- Students must return their completed Registration Form to the After-The-Bell table in the Cafeteria Lobby or register online at https://www.afterthebell.org/how-to-register no earlier than 7:15 a.m. January 8th and no later than 3:30 p.m. on January 16, 2024.
- Please complete all parts of the form including the student information page, the activity selection page, and the medical information (please note ATB does not have access to school medical records). Registration forms must be signed by the parents/guardians and the student. Students will not be accepted into the After-The-Bell without a parent/guardian signature on the Registration Form. It is important that you fill in completely your son/daughter's registration form on both sides.
- Students may register for one, two, or all three days of a program. Students must select
 two activities each day from 3-4:00 pm and 4-5:00 pm OR a double session from 3-5:00
 pm. Students must participate in the entire program from 3:00-5:00 pm on any day they
 attend After-The-Bell and must stay for both sessions on any day they register.
- Students <u>must</u> list their 1st, 2nd, and 3rd choices for activities. After-The-Bell makes every effort to provide students with their first choice of activity. However, due to the volume of students involved in After-The-Bell, that is not always possible.
- Be sure to match the days you want to come with the activities available that day. Example: If Basketball is offered on Tuesday, do not put it in a Thursday slot. Make sure to write a 1 next to your 1st choice activity, 2 to your second choice and 3 to your third.
- Parents will be notified of activity assignments by letters sent home (via homerooms) by
 January 18, 2024. Please notify us in writing before activities begin if your child will not be
 participating in the assigned activities. Check the activity assignment posters which will be
 posted outside the Cafeteria. If your name is not on the list, please see Ms. Paola Rosas in C106.
- If a student will not attend scheduled activities that day, please send an email or a note, signed by a parent/guardian to the After-The-Bell office located in C106. When advance notice is not possible, please email AfterTheBell@kcsd.org, call 610-268-5889.

- A student who is absent or suspended from school for the day may not attend After-The-Bell that day.
- Students are encouraged not to change activities after the program begins. It is expected that all participating students will follow existing school rules and our code of conduct during After-The-Bell. Students who choose not to follow the rules may be dismissed. Parents will be informed of any discipline problems which may lead to the removal of their child from the program. Thank you!
